

Price Order No. 1274 (Amendment No. 2 of Price Order No. 1225) (Eggs)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following amending Price Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1274, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1225* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 2nd day of August, 1951.

3. The Second and Fourth Schedules to the principal Order (as substituted by Price Order No. 1271†) are hereby amended by omitting the references to the Wellington Egg Price Area, and substituting the following references respectively :—
