New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorize the Blenheim Borough Council to permit the laying-off of the proposed street described in the Schedule hereto at a width for the whole of its length of less than 66 ft., but not less than 50 ft., subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the said proposed street within a distance of 33 ft. from the centre-line of the said street.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 31 of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act 1948 and section 125 of the Public Works Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby authorizes the Dunedin City Council to permit the laying-off of part Easter Crescent extension described in the Schedule hereto at a width for the whole of its length of less than 66 ft., but not less than 50 ft., and part Seaview Terrace extension described in the Schedule hereto at a width for the whole of its length of less than 66 ft., but not less than 52.8 ft., subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land fronting the said streets (except as to Lots 23 and 25, D.P. 4300) within a distance of 48 ft. from the centre-lines of the said streets.
