WHEREAS by Order in Council made on the 7th day of May 1947, and subject to the determinations as to borrowing and repayment therein set out, consent was given to the raising by the Waipawa County Council (hereinafter called the said local authority) of the sum of twelve thousand nine hundred and twenty pounds (£12,920) being the balance then unraised of a loan of twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) known as "Bridges Loan 1939" (hereinafter called the said loan):

And whereas the authority conferred by the said Order in Council has not yet been exercised to the extent of seven thousand nine hundred and twenty pounds (£7,920):

And whereas the authority has lapsed in accordance with the provisions of clause (6) of the said Order in Council, and it is not now lawful or competent for the said local authority to raise the balance of the said loan or any portion thereof, except in accordance with the provisions of a further Order in Council that may be issued pursuant to section 11 of the Local Government Loans Board Act 1926 (hereinafter called the said Act):

And whereas the said local authority is now desirous of raising the balance of the said loan amounting to seven thousand nine hundred and twenty pounds (£7,920) (hereinafter called the said sum) and it is expedient to authorize the said local authority to raise the said sum or any portion thereof on the conditions herein-

Now, therefore, pursuant to section 11 of the said Act, as set out in section 29 of the Finance Act 1932 (No. 2), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby consents to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said sum up to the amount of seven thousand nine hundred and twenty pounds (£7,920) for the purpose for which the said loan was authorized, and in giving such consent hereby determines as follows:

(1) The term for which the said sum or any part thereof may

be raised shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said sum or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds five shillings

lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding three pounds five shillings (£3 5s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said sum or any part thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be repaid by equal aggregate annual or half-yearly instalments extending over the term as determined in (1) above.

(4) The payment of such instalments shall be made in New Zealand, and no such instalments shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the borrowing of the said sum or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount raised. amount raised.

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.
