PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following amending Price Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1365 and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1337\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
2. This Order shall come into force on the 27th day of March 1952.
