Board of Trade Notice No. 24-Public Inquiry Into Tariff Duties on Cigars

> Board of Trade 28 April 1952.

1. The Board of Trade proposes to inquire into and report upon the question of what rate of duty should be imposed under Tariff Item 76, which reads as follows: "Cigars, including the veight of every band, wrapper, or attachment, to any cigar. The present rates are:-

British Preferential—20s. per pound plus surtax at the rate of one-twentieth of the amount of duty in respect of goods imported from Ireland (except Northern Ireland), Union of South Africa, India, Pakistan, and Canada. Most Favoured Nation.—22s. per pound.

General.—24s. per pound plus surtax at the rate of one-twentieth of the amount of duty.

2. For the purpose of taking evidence on the review of this Tariff Item, the Board will hold a Public Inquiry commencing on Tuesday, 24 June 1952, at 10.30 a.m., in the Board Room, First Floor, Departmental Building, Stout Street, Wellington.

3. Any person who intends to tender evidence should comply

with the notes for the guidance of witnesses which have been approved by the Board. A copy of these notes may be perused at the office of any Collector of Customs or may be obtained on

at the office of any contents of Customs of May be obtained on application to the undersigned.

4. A typewritten statement of the evidence to be tendered, compiled in accordance with these notes of guidance, should be lodged with the undersigned on or before Tuesday, 17 June 1952. Each statement will, in general, need to be read under oath at the Public Inquiry by the person tendering it.
