1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1376 and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1335* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 8th day of May 1952.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by omitting the table to subclause (1) of clause 11 with respect to distributors' prices and substituting the following table:—
