Vesting the Control of a Reserve in the Ngataki Public Hall Board

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is a reserve duly set apart for a public hall site:

And whereas it is expedient that the control of the said reserve should be vested in a special Board as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, pursuant to section 17 of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act 1923, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby vests the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

Raharaha Nehemia, Henry Norman, James Norman, Leonard Pene, Lawrence Petricevich, Arthur Subritzky, and Matthew Thompson,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Ngataki Public Hall Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

- 1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Saturday, the 12th day of July 1952, at 3 o'clock p.m., in the Ngataki Public Hall, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business at such time and place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.
- 2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.
- 3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
- 4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
- 5. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
- 6. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.
- 7. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.
