Lighted Aircraft Beacon Established

MARINERS are advised that an occasional alternating flashing light, conspicuous from seaward, exists in the following position:—

(a) Lat. 41° 30'9 S., long. 173° 52'3 E. (approx.) on Chart N.Z. 23.

(b) Lat. 41° 30'1 S., long. 174° 04'7 E. (approx.) on Charts 695, 2054, and 3629. The light bears 083½° distant 8.25 miles from Tracking Point Light, position (b).

Description: Alt. Fl. G.W. 3.75 sec. (Occas.).
