WHEREAS, on the 3rd day of November 1952, pursuant to section 63 of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), the election for members of the Upper Hutt Licensing Trust, held on the 23rd day of August 1952, was declared void:

And whereas, by section 66 of the said Act it is provided that where an election or poll is declared void a fresh election or poll shall, on a day to be fixed by the Returning Officer, being not later than twenty-five days after the date of such declaration, be held or taken under the same provisions so far as practicable as the voided election or poll:

And whereas, by reason of the requirements of section 7 of the said Act and section 6 of the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act 1946, it is not possible for the fresh election required by section 66 of the said Act to be held within the period of twenty-five days prescribed:

And whereas it is expedient to extend the time for holding such election:

Now, therefore, pursuant to section 71 of the said Act, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby extends the time prescribed by section 66 of the said Act within which a fresh election for members of the Upper Hutt Licensing Trust is required to be held to forty days from the 3rd day of November 1952.
