The Import Control Exemption (No. 5) 1952

PURSUANT to regulation 15 of the Import Control Regulations 1938*, the Minister of Customs hereby gives notice as follows:—

1. (1) This notice may be cited as the Import Control Exemption Notice (No. 5) 1952.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 5th day of December 1952.

2. Goods of the classes specified in the First Schedule hereto, imported from and being the produce or manufacture of any country other than the countries specified in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby exempted from the requirement of a licence under the said regulations.

Varying a Notice Declaring Parts of the Rangiriri Tribal District to be Tribal Committee Areas Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Ernest Bowyer Corbett, Minister of Maori Affairs, hereby vary the notice dated the 17th day of November 1950 and published in the *Gazette* on the 23rd day of November 1950 at page 2015, declaring parts of the Rangiriri Tribal District to be tribal committee areas for the purpose of the said Act by excluding from the Schedule thereto the description of the Taniwha Tribal Committee area and substituting therefor the description appearing in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

TANIWHA TRIBAL COMMITTEE AREA

ALL that area bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station B in Block XIV, Opaheke Survey District; thence proceeding north-easterly along a right line to the south-western corner of Lot 5 on the plan numbered 9284 deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence easterly along a right line to the intersection of the middle of the Pokeno-Miranda Road with the western boundary of the Wharekawa Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station 135 (Rataroa) in Block VIII, Wharekawa Survey District, a right line to the north-western corner of Section 28, Block VII, Piako Survey District, along the south-western boundaries of the said Section 28, parts Sections 4 and 5 of the said Block VII, part Section 12 of Block VII aforesaid, and Lot 2 of the said Section 12, along the abutment of a public road, another part of the south-western boundary of the said Section 12, the abutment of another public road, and a further part of the south-western boundary of the said Section 12, and the south-western boundary of Section 5, Block XI, Piako Survey District, and along the western boundary of Section 1, Block XV, Piako Survey District, to Trig. Station 2042 (Ratawera) in Block XV, Piako Survey District, a right line to Trig. Station 2043 in Block XV, Piako Survey District, and a right line in the direction of Trig. Station 1230, in Block V, Hapuakohe Survey District, to its intersection with the production of a right line between Trig. Station Kapukapu in Block XIII, Piako Survey District, and Trig. Station 1229 in Block I, Hapuakohe Survey District; thence northerly to and along the last-mentioned right line to Trig. Station Kapukapu aforesaid; thence north-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station B, the point of commencement.
