### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 26th day of November 1952

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the Marlborough County Council (hereinafter called the Council, which term shall include its successors and assigns unless the context requires a different construction), the management of the wharf and shed at the Grove, Queen Charlotte Sound, such vesting to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and prescribes that the dues and rates set forth in the Second hereto, and prescribes that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the Council for the use of the said wharf and shed.

### FIRST SCHEDULE

### Conditions

- 1. The vesting of the said wharf and shed is subject to the Foreshore Licence Regulations 1940, and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.
- 2. The term of the vesting shall be fourteen years from the 17th day of November 1952.
- 3. The annual sum payable by the Council to the Minister shall be Is. payable on demand.
- 4. The master of every vessel discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.
- 5. The Council shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at the Council's own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels: Provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister.

# INTERPRETATION AND DUES

- 1. The following terms used in this Order in Council shall have the meanings in this clause given to them except where they are inconsistent with the context, viz:—
  - "Goods" shall mean all wares, merchandise, and commodities of every description, and all chattels, live-stock, and other articles:
  - "Master" shall mean any person for the time being in charge
  - of any vessel:

    Vessel'' shall mean every description of vessel and shall include launches and boats.
