Board of Trade Notice No. 51—Review of Import Licensing

IT is hereby notified that the Board of Trade has examined the objections lodged to the proposed exemption from import licensing of the following items in the Import Licensing Schedule and has decided not to recommend decontrol until after a review of the appropriate tariff duties has taken place.
