conditions hereinafter set forth, a licence authorizing the
Morningside Timber Company, Limited, a company duly
incorporated under the Companies Act 1933 and having its
registered office at Auckland (hereinafter referred to as the
licensee), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric
lines described in the Schedule hereto.

CONDITIONS

IMPLIED CONDITIONS

1. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

2. The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor respectively.

SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

3. The system of supply shall be classified under paragraph (j) of regulation $21{\text -}01$ of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and shall be a direct-current system at a normal rated pressure of 32 volts.

DURATION OF LICENCE

4. Unless sooner lawfully determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1974 or until electrical energy is available from an Electric Power Board or some other public source of supply, whichever is the earlier.

SCHEDULE

LINES for the supply of electrical energy by the system of supply hereinbefore described, commencing from the licensee's generator and proceeding as follows:

- (a) In a northerly direction to a grocery store.
 (b) In an easterly direction to a cookhouse.
 (c) In a north-westerly direction generally to a hall.

All being situated in State Forest 96, Block XIV, Ranginui Survey District, in the County of Waitomo.

The said lines being more particularly shown by means of blue lines on the plan marked S.H.D. 250, deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington.
