Consenting to the Raising of a Loan of £23,000 by the Dunedin City Council and Prescribing the Conditions Thereof

WHEREAS the Dunedin City Council (hereinafter called WHEREAS the Dunedin City Council (hereinafter called the said local authority), being desirous of raising a loan of twenty-three thousand pounds (£23,000) to be known as 'Public Works Loan No. 2 1953' (hereinafter called the said loan) for the purpose of constructing kerbs, channels, paving streets, and carrying out street improvements generally, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act 1926 (hereinafter called the said Act), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

raising of the said loan: Now, therefore, pursuant to section 11 of the said Act as set out in section 29 of the Finance Act 1932 (No. 2), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby consents to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of twenty-three thousand pounds (£23,000), and in giving such consent hereby determines as follows:

The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be raised shall be ten (10) years.
The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate or rates exceeding four pounds

to the lenger or lengers a rate or rates exceeding four pounds $(\pounds 4)$ per centum per annum. 3. The said loan or any part thereof shall be repaid by the annual redemption of debentures in the years set out in the first column of the Schedule hereunder of the amounts stated opposite each such year in the second column of the said Schedule.
