RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act 1926 and amendments thereto, the Poverty Bay Electric Power Board hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds (£150,000) authorized to be raised by the Poverty Bay Electric Power Board under the above-mentioned Act and amendments thereto for the purpose of supplying and distributing electrical energy for the benefit of the constituent districts of the Uawa County and the Waiapu County within the Poverty Bay Electric Power District, and for such purpose to do all or any of such matters and things which the Board is empowered to do by the Electric Power Boards Act 1925 and its amendments, and in particular, but without limiting in any way any of the aforesaid powers, to provide, erect, and construct additions and extensions to the present system of electrical distribution and reticulation, to purchase plant, tools, instruments, equipment, motor vehicles, land, way-leaves, easements, and any existing electrical installations and plant, to erect generating stations, buildings, or offices within or without such districts as hereinbefore defined, and to make provision for financial assistance to consumers as provided by the said Act, the Poverty Bay Electric Power Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of nine-sixteenths of a penny (½ d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property in that portion of the Poverty Bay Electric Power District as is contained in the constituent districts of the Uawa County and the Waiapu County; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years (25), or until such loan is duly paid up."
