should be vested in a special Board as hereinafter provided : Now, therefore, pursuant to section 17 of the Public Reserves and Domains Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby vests the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or rovoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely,

Herbert William Claude Hight, Kenneth David Saunders Hight, Clarence Cecil Kjestrup, Donald James Law, and George Edward Stockwell,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Kohuratahi Public Hall Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board), with the powers and subject to the conditions here-inafter contained, that is to say:

The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Friday, the 20th day of November 1953, at 8 o'clock p.m., at the Kohuratahi Public Hall, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business at such time and place as may from time to time be ixed by the Board. 2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and

The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor. 3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes

The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the 31st day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the board soon as possible after each annual meeting.

The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a public hall, and shall also afford settlers and residents of Kohuratahi and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said hall as may from time to time be determined by the Board, provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said hall.
