

Price Order No. 1504 (Amendment No. 3 of Price Order No. 1147—Bread)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following amending Price Order:

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1504, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1147\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
2. This Order shall come into force on the 4th day of December 1953.
3. The principal Order is hereby amended by adding thereto the following clause:

“SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

“6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any bread to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of bread or may relate generally to all bread sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.”
