Waikiwi River Works Loan 1953, £4,465

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Bodies' Loans Act 1926, the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941, and all other powers in that behalf it enabling, the Southland Catchment Board hereby resolves

as follows:

''That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £4,465, known as the Waikiwi River Works Loan 1953, authorized to be raised by the Southland Catchment Board under the above-mentioned Acts for the purpose of meeting the Board's share of the cost of improvements to the Waikiwi River from its confluence with the Oreti River to the Invercargill-Queenstown State Highway, a distance of approximately seven (7) miles, the said Board hereby makes and levies a special rate, on a graduated scale according to a classification list made for the purposes of such rate of the lands within that part of the Southland Catchment District defined in the Southland Catchment Board Empowering Act 1953 and known as the Waikiwi River Rating District, Number 2, as follows, namely: Number 2, as follows, namely:

Ten shillings (10s.) per acre on lands classified as Class A; Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per acre on lands

classified as Class B;
Five shillings (5s.) per acre on lands classified as Class C;
Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per acre on lands classified as Class D;
