75. Class K

Paragraph 1A: *Omit* this paragraph, and *substitute* the following:

1A. Sawn *Pinus radiata*, larch, and douglas fir timber in the following minimum quantities, railed for distances exceeding 100 miles, will be charged at Class K rate less 1s. per 100 superficial feet:

Each 10-ton L Wagon	Each LA Wagon	Each Lo Wagon	Each 16-ton U Bogie Wagon	Each 20-ton U Bogie Wagon	Each RB or UB Bogie Wagon
4,250	5,100	6,400	6,800	8,500	10,600

Charges on lesser quantities of sawn *Pinus radiata*, larch, and douglas fir timber will be computed at the foregoing minima, or at the ordinary rate for timber, whichever is cheaper.

Paragraph 3: *Omit* this paragraph, and *substitute* the following:

3. Small lots of timber under 100 superficial feet may be charged on actual weight at Class C if cheaper than the charge for timber in small lots.

76. Live-stock

Paragraph 3, Part Wagons: After the word "sheep" in the fifth line, *add* the word "calves".

77. Class N

Paragraph 2, Minimum Charges: *Omit* this paragraph, and *substitute*:

2. Minimum Charges.—Except where otherwise provided, any less quantity than the minimum prescribed will be charged at such minimum or on actual weight at Class D whichever is cheaper. The following commodities in any less quantity than the minimum prescribed will be charged at such minimum or on actual weights at Class E plus 50 per cent, provided that the charges will not be less than when computed at Class N on actual weight plus handling charges, also tarpaulin charges if incurred:

- Bags, old, consigned to paper making factories.
- Newspapers, old, in bundles, for packing or wrapping, or for waste.
- Paper, waste.
- Rags in bales or bundles.
- Sacking, old, for paper making.
- Cotton-waste, for paper making.
- Bottles, glass, empty, old.
- Loose coke or charcoal. (The charge in any four-wheeled wagon will not be less than as for 4 tons at Class N rate.)

94. Household Removals and Furniture Containers

Paragraph 2, Containers: *Omit* this paragraph, and *substitute* the following:

2. Containers.—Furniture and household effects, including sewing-machines, bicycles (pedal), pianos, organs, perambulators, and push-chairs, in furniture containers (including large packing-cases or motor-car cases) will be charged Class C plus 20 per cent, computed on the gross weight of the container and contents, and conveyed at the sole risk of the owner. The following minimum weights will apply for charging purposes:

Containers up to 11 ft. in length	1 ton per four-wheeled wagon.
Containers over 11 ft. in length	2 tons per four-wheeled wagon.
Containers requiring the use of a bogie wagon	3 tons per bogie wagon.

98. Tarpaulins

Paragraph 1: *Omit* "Regulations 76, 83, 84, or 90", in the second line, and *insert* "Regulations 75, 76, 83, 84, or 90".

100. Cranage

Paragraph 1, subparagraph (b): *Omit* this subparagraph, and *insert* the following:

(b) Any package or article exceeding 30 cwt.	Charge for Cranage 7s. 6d. per ton.

106. Check and Empty Railway Wagons: Bogie and Special Wagons

Paragraph 3, subparagraph (a): *Omit* this subparagraph and *substitute* the following:

3. Special Wagons.—(a) Empty petrol-tank wagons will be conveyed under the provisions of regulation 88, paragraph 6.
