THE RIGHT HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928 and the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

LICENCE

1. This Order may be cited as the Opunake Electric Power Board Electric Lines Licence 1955.

2. Subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, the Opunake Electric Power Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) is hereby authorized to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines, and to construct electric works within the area of supply described in the Schedule hereto.

3. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

4. The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

5. The systems of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (h) of regulation 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

6. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 24th day of January 1965.

7. The Order in Council dated the 24th day of January 1923, and published in the *Gazette* on the 1st day of February 1923, authorizing the licensee to use water for the purpose of generating electricity and to use certain electric lines, as amended by the Order in Council dated the 19th day of September 1927, and published in the *Gazette* on the 22nd day of the same month, at page 2902, is hereby revoked in so far as it authorizes the licensee to use electric lines, but not in so far as it authorizes the licensee to use water for the purpose of generating electricity.

8. The Order in Council dated the 18th day of February 1924, and published in the *Gazette* on the 21st day of the same month, authorizing the licensee to use certain electric lines is hereby revoked.

PURSUANT to section 186 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 and section 125 of the Public Works Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby authorizes the Green Island Borough Council to permit the laying-off of the proposed street described in the Schedule hereto at a width for parts of its length of less than 66 ft. but not less than 40 ft. subject to the condition that no building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the land shown edged green (except Lots 13 and 14) on the plan marked P.W.D. 146096 referred to in the said Schedule within a distance of 15 ft. of the side line of the said street.

PURSUANT to section 112 of the Public Works Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby orders and declares that the portion of road described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, become county road.
