ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 4th day of April 1955

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Rabbit Nuisance Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Te Puke Rabbit District Order 1955.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The boundaries of the Te Puke Rabbit District, which was constituted by Order in Council on the 16th day of June 1952,* are hereby altered and redefined; and as from the commencement of this order, the boundaries of the said district shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

BOUNDARIES OF THE TE PUKE RABBIT DISTRICT

ALL that area of approximately 52,300 acres in the South Auckland Land District, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the line of mean high water on the eastern shore of the entrance to the Tauranga Harbour, and running south-easterly generally along the line of mean high water of the Bay of Plenty, to the right bank of the Kaituna River; thence westerly generally up the right bank of the Kaituna River aforesaid, to a point in line with the western boundary of part of Tumu Kaituna No. 1 Block, as shown on D.P. 16773; thence along a right line across the Kaituna River aforesaid, to and along the middle of Belt's Road to the middle of the Paeroa-Whakatane State Highway; thence southerly generally along the middle of that highway to a point in line with the northern boundary of the Borough
