

and the western boundary of Run 418; thence southerly and easterly along the eastern and northern boundaries of Run 418 to the eastern bush edge, being part of the boundary of the Sounds (Fiordland) National Park as described in the Fifth Schedule of the National Parks Act 1952; thence generally northerly along the eastern edge of the bush to the southern boundary of Caples Survey District; thence westerly along that boundary to Pass Creek; thence generally northerly along the left banks of Pass Creek and the Hollyford River to the southern boundary of Run 471; thence south-westerly and north-westerly along the southern and western boundaries of Run 471 to Cascade Creek; thence westerly along a straight line to Mount Madeline; thence generally north-westerly along the watershed through Tutoko Peak to Pembroke Peak and along the watershed between John o' Groats River and Thurso River to Stripe Point, about one mile and a half south of the mouth of John o' Groats River; thence generally north-easterly along the sea coast to the point of commencement; including all the adjacent islands.

SOUTHLAND LAND, REGISTRATION, AND LAND REGISTRATION DISTRICTS
