PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby licenses and permits William Fraser McCallum of Auckland, trading under the style or title of McCallum Brothers (hereinafter called the licensees, which term shall include their executors, administrators, or assigns, unless the context requires a different construction) to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Lawson's Creek in Waitemata Harbour as shown on plan marked M.D. 9638 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a wharf as shown on the said plan, such licence to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and prescribes that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the licensees for the use of the said wharf.

## FIRST SCHEDULE

#### CONDITIONS

- 1. This licence is subject to the Foreshore Licence Regulations 1940, and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.
- 2. The term of the licence shall be fourteen years from the 1st day of April 1955.
- 3. The premium payable by the licensees shall be five pounds (£5), and the annual sum so payable, three pounds (£3).
- 4. The Master of every vessel loading at the said wharf shall discharge all ballast above high-water mark or at such place as may be appointed by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.
