**P**URSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order:

The Order in Council dated the 9th day of February 1949 and published in *New Zealand Gazette*, the 15th day of February 1949, Vol. I, page 572, is hereby amended by omitting the Schedule to that Order in Council and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to this Order in Council.

SCHEDULE

"AREA INCLUDED IN THE WAIKAWA RURAL FIRE DISTRICT

"ALL that area in the Southland Land District, Southland County, containing approximately 43,000 acres, situated in Blocks II, III, VI, and VII, Otara Survey District, Block XIV, Mokoreta Survey District, and Blocks I, II, V to XVII, Waikawa Survey District, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the east, north, and again towards the east by the boundary of the Otago Land District, and by Sections 13 and 2, Block XVI, Waikawa Survey District; towards the south-west by the south-western side of a road passing through Section 8, Block XVI aforesaid; towards the north-east by the north-eastern side of a road; towards the south by the southern side of Longbeach Road; towards the south-west generally by Section 12, Block XVI aforesaid, Sections 18, 9, and 7, Block I, Waikawa Survey District, Sections 5 and 7, Block XVII, Waikawa Survey District, by the south-western side of a road, to and across the Waikawa River, and again by the south-western side of a road to the Kennington-Waikawa Main Highway, by the eastern side of that highway, and by Sections 1, 50, and 49, Block VII, Waikawa Survey District; towards the east generally by Sections 49, 21, 22, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31, 32, 33, and 34, Block VII aforesaid, to and across the Kennington-Waikawa Main Highway and by the eastern side of that highway and the eastern side of a road, and by Section 31, Block II, Waikawa Survey District; towards the south-east generally by Sections 14, 13, and 12, Block XI, and Sections 7 and 14, Block VIII, Waikawa Survey District; towards the south generally by the southern side of the Haldane-Waikawa Road, by a reservoir reserve, and by Section 49, Block IX, Waikawa Survey District; towards the south-west generally by the Haldane Estuary and by the south-western side of a road; towards the south and east by part of Section 8, Block VII, Otara Survey District; towards the south-east by the south-eastern side of the Otara-Haldane Road; towards the west generally by Sections 11, 10, 6, and 2, Block II, and Section 17, Block III, Otara Survey District, and by the eastern side of a road passing through Sections 17 and 16, Block III aforesaid, to and across Graham's Road; towards the north-east by the north-eastern side of Graham's Road; towards the west by Section 42, Block VI, Otara Survey District; towards the north by Sections 31 and 24, Block VI, Otara Survey District; towards the west by Section 24, Block VI aforesaid, towards the north by Sections 21 and 22, Block IV, Otara Survey District; towards the west by Sections 22 and 22R and part of Section 17, Block IV aforesaid; towards the north generally by Sections 6 and 7, Block III, Waikawa Survey District, by the northern side of a road and by Sections 10, 21, 22, and 24, Block IV, Waikawa Survey District; towards the east by Section 3, Block VII, Waikawa Survey District; towards the north by Sections 3 and 4, Block VII aforesaid; towards the west by the left bank of the Waikawa River; towards the north by Section 6, Block V, Waikawa Survey District; towards the west by Sections 6 and 5, Block V, Waikawa Survey District; towards the north by the northern side of a road; towards the west by the western side of a road, and again towards the north by the northern side of a road. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 217/16 deposited in the Head Office of the New Zealand Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red."

*Authorizing the Poverty Bay Electric Power Board to Erect and Use Electric Lines Within Part of the Waikohu County*

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

**P**URSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928 and the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby authorizes the Poverty Bay Electric Power Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines within the area of supply described in the Schedule hereto; and further, for the purpose of section 76 of the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, subject to the said conditions, hereby authorizes the licensee to construct electric works within the said area of supply.

CONDITIONS

IMPLIED CONDITIONS

1. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

2. The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations hereafter made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof respectively.

SYSTEMS OF SUPPLY

3. The systems of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (d), (e), and (f) of Regulation 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

DURATION OF LICENCE

4. This licence shall, unless sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 1st day of November 1968.

SCHEDULE

AREA OF SUPPLY

ALL that portion of the Waikohu County included in the Poverty Bay Electric Power District by the Proclamation dated the 3rd day of May 1955, and published in the *Gazette* on the 5th day of the same month, at page 725.
