## ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited at the Hawksbury Rabbit District Order 1955.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the

date of its notification in the Gazette.

2. The boundaries of the Hawksbury Rabbit District, which was constituted by Order in Council, on the 3rd day of February 1953,\* are hereby altered and redefined; and as from the commencement of this order, the boundaries of the said district shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

## BOUNDARIES OF THE HAWKSBURY RABBIT DISTRICT

Boundaries of the Hawksbury Rabbit District
