

## Decisions Under the Customs Acts

THE following decisions in interpretation of the Customs Tariff which appeared in previous Tariff Orders are repeated for the purpose of bringing up to date and amending the new pages 126, 140, 141, 142, 143, 144, 145, 145A which were recently issued.

353 (13)	Controls, hydraulic, comprising pump, control valve, and oil reservoir, with interconnecting oil lines, for attachment to tractors to control the operation of equipment such as bulldozers and loader shovels, even if the controls are attached to the tractors at the time of importation	164-2/62/4
353 (13)	Drilling, punching, and perforating machines and appliances for paper, other than those admissible under Tariff item 352 (b)	171-2/18/58
353 (13)	Folding machines for paper and cardboard, designed for office use	168-2/18/-
353 (13)	Heaters incorporating electric motors and fans for use in motor vehicles, and which use heat from the engine cooling system. (See also Tariff item 356 (1) (c).)	153-3/189/27
353 (13)	Pumps— Rotary vane types .. .. .	160-2/62/4
353 (13)	Valves (See also Tariff items 352 and 353 (2))— Hydrants, fire, other than screw-down or spring loaded ball hydrants. (T.O. 70.) Sluice gates. (T.O. 85.) Valves and cocks, other than those classed under Tariff items 352 and 353 (2). (T.O. 46.) Valves designed for use on high pressure oil lines to control the flow of oil to hydraulic pistons. (T.O. 160.) Valve seat castings, centrifugal, in the rough, for oil engines. (Replaces the decisions under "Valves" on page 145A)

353 (13)	Brick .. . Pipe moulding machines, also moulds .. . concrete pipes. (See revised decision.)
353 (13)	Earth moving— Angledozer. Buckets, dredge, of pressed mild steel. Bulldozers. Scoops, earth, of under 20 cubic feet capacity. Scrapers, drag and rotary, of under 20 cubic feet capacity. Shovels, excavating and loading .. . Tariff item 352. Shovels, excavating, hydraulic, mounted .. . trench hoes. (See decisions Tariff item 349.)
353 (13)	Laundry .. . Ironing machines or presses, electrically heated .. . 30 in. in length. (See now Tariff item 353 (12) (a).)
353 (13)	Perforating machines and appliances for paper .. . office use. (See revised decision.)
353 (13)	Presses .. . Steam heated, for pressing garments .. . Tariff item 352. (See now Tariff item 353 (12) (b).)
