*Scheme of Control of Huntly College*

PURSUANT to section 92 of the Education Act 1914, the Minister of Education hereby approves of Huntly College being controlled in accordance with the Standard Scheme of Control for Secondary Schools published in the *Gazette* on 6 December 1928, Volume III, page 3451:

Provided that:

(a) Clause 7 of the Standard Scheme shall be read as if the words "Council of the nearest borough within five miles of the school" were omitted, and the words "Huntly Borough Council" were substituted therefor:

(b) Clause 11 of the Standard Scheme shall be read as if the words "Such election shall be held in the first week of the month of May in the year 1929" were omitted, and the words "The first such election shall be held not later than the first week of the month of May in the year 1957, and such an election shall be held in the first week of the month of May in the year 1959" were substituted therefor:

(c) Clause 19 of the Standard Scheme shall be read as if every reference to the year 1929 was a reference to the year 1959:

(d) Clause 43 of the Standard Scheme shall be read as if the words "The secretary shall be insured under a fidelity bond for a sum of not less than five hundred pounds" were omitted.
