Declaring Land to be Crown Land

PURSUANT to section 265 of the Maori Affairs Act 1953, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land and to be subject to the Land Act 1948.

SCHEDULE

WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICT

FIRSTLY, all that piece of land containing 551 acres 1 rood 19 perches, more or less, being the land known as Te Rerengaohau 1, situated in Block II, Moutere Survey Dis-trict, as shown on the plan marked W.D. 3976 deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

Secondly, all that piece of land containing 209 acres and 31 perches, more or less, being the land known as Te Rerengaohau Part 2B, situated in Block II, Moutere Survey District, as shown on the plan marked W.D. 4073 deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, now held for the use, convenience, or enjoyment of the Auckland-Hamilton Motorway, is hereby set apart for State housing purposes; and I also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the 5th day of November 1956.
