BANKS PENINSULA TROTTING CLUB

RESOLUTION

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Banks Peninsula Trotting Club at a meeting held on the 17th day of October 1956 at Motukarara, with a recommendation by the chairman of such club, Mr Cyril E. Gray, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act 1908 section 33

Excellency the Governor-General in pursuance of the Gaming Act 1908, section 33.

Mr Cyril E. Gray, the chairman of such club and the meeting, moved, and Mr G. H. Cowles seconded, and it was resolved that such regulations should be adopted and that the chairman and secretary be authorised to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:

BANKS PENINSULA TROTTING CLUB

REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act 1908)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act 1908 and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Banks Peninsula Trotting Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club") doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Waihora Park, Motukarara Domain and Freehold, situated in the district of Motukarara and known as the Banks Peninsula Racing Club's Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings. for race meetings.

(1) These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *Gazette*.

(2) In these regulations the words "bookmaker", "racing club", and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act 10008

(3) The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:

(a) Bookmakers.
(b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
(c) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Conference, or the New Zealand Trotting Association.
(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort

(d) Common prostitutes and persons who habitually consort with thieves or persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

means of support.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of housebreaking or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act 1908, and also idle and disorderly persons, rogues, and vagabonds, and incorrigible rogues convicted under the Police Offences Act 1908, and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act 1908. Provided always that the Executive Committee appointed by the New Zealand Racing Conference, upon being satisfied by evidence as to character and otherwise that any person who, by reason of any conviction, comes within the scope of this regulation, should have relief from the effect thereof, may grant exemption to any such person, and may at any time revoke any such exemption without notice to such person, and without assigning any reason for such revocation.

The foregoing regulations of the Banks Peninsula Trotting Club were made and passed by such club on the 17th day of October 1956 and signed by the chairman and secretary.
