ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 31st day of January 1956

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

DURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby vests in the Akaroa Borough Council (hereinafter called the Council, which term shall include its successors or assigns, unless the context requires a different construction) the management of the wharves at Akaroa known as the "Town Wharf" and "Daly's Wharf", as shown on approved plans marked M.D. 1333, 1334, 1335, 1336, and 4017 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, such vesting to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto, and hereby prescribes that the dues and rates specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be charged and taken by the Council for the use of the said wharves.

FIRST SCHEDULE

- 1. The vesting of the management of the wharves is subject to the Foreshore Licence Regulations 1940, with the exception of clause 21 of the said regulations, which for the purpose of this Order in Council is hereby excluded, and the provisions of the said regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.
- 2. The term of the vesting shall be fourteen years from the 21st day of December 1955.
- 3. The master of every vessel discharging ballast at the said wharves shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark or at such place as may be approved by the Minister or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.
