ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of February 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL  
PURSUANT to section 439 of the Maori Affairs Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby sets apart the Maori freehold land described in the Schedule hereto for the common use and benefit of the Maori people as a Maori reservation for the purposes of a burial ground.
