

Overcoats and raincoats—

- Maids' of gaberdine and all other types except *plastic and oily canvas*, school uniform.
- Boys', of gaberdine and all other types except *plastic and oily canvas*, school uniform.
- Rubber and rubberised clothing, school uniform.
- Shorts, boys', school uniform.
- Skirts, maids', of wool or containing wool, school uniform.
- Suits, boys', of wool or containing wool, school uniform.
- Suits, maids' of wool or containing wool, school uniform.
- Trousers, boys', school uniform.
- Underwear, knitted, except *nylon, perlon, orlon, dacron, or terylene*.
- Underwear, woven, infants'—all materials.
- Uniforms, school.

Footwear

Footwear of the following kinds:

- (a) Rubber footwear of the following types:
 - Gumboots.
 - Boots.
 - Bootees.
 - Galoshes.
 - Foot-holds.
- (b) Rubber soled tennis shoes.

GROCERIES, FOODSTUFFS, AND RELATED COMMODITIES**Groceries**

- Bananas.
- Barley—all types and varieties including seed barley and barley malted or otherwise processed but excluding *pearled barley*.
- Bran and pollard.
- Bread (except *bread sold as part of a meal and bread sold in Stewart Island*), customarily known as standard white bread, standard brown bread, starch reduced bread, whole-meal bread, vienna bread, wheatgerm bread.
- Butter.
- Cereal breakfast and dessert foods of all kinds except "*ready to eat*" cereal breakfast and dessert foods.
- Cheese, cheddar, under four months old.
- Cigarettes.
- Cream, fresh.
- Eggs, hen and duck.
- Flour, including wheatmeal, gluten, wholemeal and self raising flour, but excluding *soya bean and rye flour*.
- Fruits, dried or evaporated, of the following kinds including assortments or mixtures thereof, and excluding *crystallised or drained fruits and synthetic fruits*:
 - Sultanas.
 - Apples.
 - Apricots.
 - Dates.
 - Figs.
 - Currants.
 - Prunes.
 - Raisins.
- Fruits and fruit pulp, canned, of the following kinds:
 - Apricots.
 - Pears.
 - Peaches.
 - Pineapple.
- Golden syrup and treacle.
- Hops.
- Macaroni, spaghetti, and vermicelli in all forms.
- Malt and malt extract with or without other constituents.
- Mash, poultry, in all forms, including basic poultry ration.
- Milk, condensed, and evaporated, and milk powders with or without other constituents.
- Milk, fresh.
- Oatmeal and rolled oats, and all proprietary packs prepared therefrom.
- Oranges, imported.
- Rice, except *ground rice*.
- Stock food of the following kinds:
 - Prepared poultry food excluding *poultry spice*.
 - Wheat.
 - Barley.
 - Bran.
 - Pollard.
- Sugar, including castor sugar but excluding *icing sugar, loaf sugar and coffee sugar crystals*.
- Tea, except *China tea, and tea in fancy containers* (other than packets or bags) *less than 5 lb. in weight*.
- Vinegar, prepared from malt or sugar.
- Wheat, including seed wheat.
- Yeast, in all forms.

Intoxicating liquorIntoxicating liquor within the meaning of the Licensing Act 1908, but excluding *N.Z. wines*.**Miscellaneous**

- Kerosene, except *when sold in containers of no greater capacity than one imperial quart*.
- Methylated spirits except *when sold in containers of no greater capacity than one imperial quart*.
- Paper, greaseproof, and all varieties of wrapping paper.
- Tobacco, including raw tobacco leaf, and cigarettes but excluding *cigars and cheroots*.

HARDWARE**Builders', plumbers', and electricians' hardware**

- Basins.
- Baths.
- Bulbs, electric.
- Cables; electrical.
- Faucets.
- Globes, electric.
- Insulators.
- Lamps, electric.
- Locks, except *padlocks and lamplocks*.
- Nails, bright-steel wire, lead head, galvanised spring-head nails, galvanised clouts and nails, cement-coated nails, and finishing brads and panel pins.
- Pipes and pipe fittings except *pipe fittings of brass*.
- Ridging metal.
- Sanitary earthenware.
- Sinks.
- Spouting and downpipe, metal, and brackets.
- Staples of all kinds, except *staples for use in stapling machines*.
- Tanks.
- Taps, high- and low-pressure.
- Wires, excluding *bare copper, binding, and wire netting*.

Miscellaneous hardware

- Bolts.
- Brads, finishing and floor.
- Felt hair, roofing and sheathing.
- Fences, fabricated wire, not including *wire netting*.
- Gates, metal.
- Lock sets (excluding *vestibule*).
- Metals, ferrous and non ferrous, in ingot, sheet, strip, bar, rod, tube, wire, sectional shapes, or in alloy forms (including aluminium, brass, copper, iron, steel, lead, zinc, tin, and tinplate), but excluding *extruded brass rod*.
- Taps.
- Tubes and tubing, metal (excluding *boiler, stay and well sinker*).
- Wire, baling, barbed, fencing, and reinforcing but not including *wire netting*.

MACHINES, VEHICLES, AND EQUIPMENT, AND SPARE PARTS THEREFOR**Farming machinery and equipment of the following kinds**

- Farm dairy machines and equipment, excluding *glass churns*.
- Harvesting and haymaking equipment.
- Planting, seeding, and fertilising machines and equipment.
- Preparing, grading, and related machines and equipment.
- Soil tilling and preparing machines and equipment.

Transportation machines and equipment of the following kinds

- Motor vehicles of the following kinds including chassis and cabs therefor:
 - Cars
 - Trucks
 - Vans
 - Ranch and station wagons.

Other machinery of the following kinds

- Engines, internal combustion, excluding *stationary, outboard, marine, and aircraft engines*.

RUBBER GOODS

- Clothing, rubber or rubberised, school uniform.
- Footwear—see Clothing and Footwear.
- Milking machine rubberware.
- Pneumatic tires and tubes.

SERVICES**Charges, fees, rates, or commissions payable in respect of the following**

- Egg distribution and handling.
- Gas supply.
- Hotels, tariffs of licensed and unlicensed hotels, private hotels, and boarding houses other than *those exempted to date listed in addendum hereto*.
- Motion-picture theatre admission charges.
- Shipping fares and freights, excluding *lighterage charges*.
- Tire retreading, recapping and relugging charges.

- Imported sawn timber and *N.Z. grown timber* (excluding *kauri, mine props and timbers sawn in sizes peculiar to use in mines, railway sleepers and wooden fence posts*).
