Plants Declared Noxious Weeds in Waikouaiti County  
(Notice No. Ag. 6291)

PURSUANT to the Noxious Weeds Act 1950, and acting under a delegation from the Minister of Agriculture for the purpose of the said Act, the Acting Director-General of Agriculture hereby publishes the following special order made by the Waikouaiti County Council on the 26th day of April 1957.

SPECIAL ORDER

IN exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 3 of the Noxious Weeds Act 1950, the Waikouaiti County Council resolves and declares, by way of special order, that the following plants which are included in the First Schedule of the said Act be noxious weeds within the County of Waikouaiti:

Blackberry (*Rubus fruticosus* and *Rubus laciniatus*).  
Burdock (*Arctium*, any species).  
Common Broom (*Cytisus scoparius*).  
Gorse (*Ulex*, any species).  
Hemlock (*Conium maculatum*).  
Ragwort (*Senecio jacobaea*).  
Sweetbrier (*Rosa eglanteria* syn. *Rosa rubiginosa*).
