Pursuant to the Public Works Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby grants to Andrew Aitken Taylor, of Peel Forest, sheep-farmer (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), a licence, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to take and use from an unnamed stream situated in Section 36722, S.G.R. 98, Block II, Mount Peel Survey District, in the County of Geraldine, for the purpose hereinafter set forth, a stream of water not exceeding 1 cubic foot per second at any one time.

CONDITIONS

IMPLIED CONDITIONS

1. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water Power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated in and shall form part of this license, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
