- 4. The licensee is hereby authorised, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purpose of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan P.W.D. 92508:
 - (a) Headworks consisting of a dam and intake, with a water race, surge tank, and pipeline leading to the powerhouse hereinafter referred to, giving a static head of approximately 55 ft.
 (b) Water wheel and powerhouse with all necessary equipment for generating electricity, situated in Run 237H, Lindis Survey District.
 (c) Tail race leading from the said powerhouse back to the said stream.
