

OTOROHANGA BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Public Works Act 1928 and its Amendments.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Otorohanga Borough Council proposes to execute a certain public work, to wit, the construction of a pumping station and a pipeline to carry water in connection with the borough waterworks, for which purpose the lands and easement over land described in the First and Second Schedules hereto require to be taken by the Council under the provisions of the Public Works Act 1928 and its amendments.
