Town and Country Planning Act 1953—Rodney County

PUBLIC notice is hereby given that, pursuant to section 20 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1953, approval has been granted to the Rodney County Council to prepare, recommend, and approve its district scheme by sections as follows:

Section 1—

The whole of the County district dealing with the following matters as set out in the Second Schedule to the Town and Country Planning Act 1953:

- (1) The zoning or definition of areas to be used exclusively or principally for urban or rural purposes.
- (5) Public access by main communication routes.
- (9) Provision and preservation of amenities including the regulation and control of outdoor advertising.
- (10) Control of subdivision including restraint upon unnecessary encroachment of urban development upon land of high actual or potential value for the production of food.
- (11) Land subdivision standards in relation to any permitted use.
- (12) Minimum site areas and dimensions in relation to uses of land and buildings.

Section 2, 2A, 2B, etc.—

Those parts of the County which will be defined as urban development zones in section 1 of the district scheme when approved, making provision for such of the matters referred to in the Second Schedule to the Act as are appropriate to the circumstances.

Section 3—

That part of the County which will be defined as a rural zone in section 1 of the district scheme when approved, making provision for such of the matters referred to in the Second Schedule to the Act as are appropriate to the circumstances, and have not already been provided for in section 1.
