1. That the area described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby included in the Rangitaiki Drainage District.

2. That the boundaries of the Rangitaiki Drainage District as so altered shall be as defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. That the alteration of boundaries of the said district here inbefore made shall be deemed to have been effected under the Land Drainage Act 1908.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREA INCLUDED IN RANGITAIKI DRAINAGE DISTRICT .
