High Pressure Water Supply Loan 1958, £236,000

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Paparua County Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £236,000, to be known as the High Pressure Water Supply Loan 1958, authorised to be raised by the Paparua County Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of providing a high pressure water supply system for the urban districts of Upper Riccarton, Sockburn, Hornby, and Islington, including the purchase from Government of the existing water supply system in the Hornby new housing block, the said Paparua County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of .6264 pence in the pound (£) on the rateable value (on the basis of capital value) on all rateable properties comprised within the boundaries of the Sockburn County Town, the Hornby County Town, and the Islington Township; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of the said loan, being a period of 35 years, or until the loan is fully paid off."
