County Council hereby resolves as follows: "That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on the loan of £10,000 authorised to be raised by the Tauranga County Council under the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956 for the purpose of erecting workers' dwellings, the said Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one thirty-second of one penny $(\frac{1}{3}2d.)$ in the pound upon the rateable (unimproved) value of all rateable property in the County of Tauranga; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and shall be payable half yearly on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

Levin Borough Council hereby resolves as follows: "That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of twelve thousand one hundred pounds (£12,100) authorised to be raised by the Levin Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of erecting pen-sioners' flats, the said Levin Borough Council hereby makes a special rate of forty-seven four-hundredths of a penny (47/400d.) in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the Borough of Levin, comprising the whole of the Borough of Levin; and that the special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of March in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of thirty (30) years, or until the loan is fully paid off." TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1953

Section 1

The whole of the country district dealing with the follow-ing matters as set out in the Second Schedule to the Town and Country Planning Act 1953:

- Country Planning Act 1953:
 The zoning or definition of areas to be used exclusively or principally for urban or rural purposes.
 Public access by main communication routes.
 Provision and presentation of amenities including the regulation and control of outdoor advertising
 Control of subdivision, including restraint upon unneces-sary encroachment of urban development upon land of high actual or potential value for the production of food.
 Land subdivisional standards in relation to any permitted

- 12. Minimum site areas and dimensions in relation to uses of land and buildings.

SECTIONS 2, 2A, 2B, ETC.

Those parts of the county which will be defined as urban development zones in section 1 of the district scheme when approved, making provision for such of the matters referred to in the Second Schedule to the Act as are appropriate to the circumstances.

SECTION 3 That part of the county which will be defined as a rural zone in section 1 of the district scheme when approved, making provision for such of the matters referred to in the Second Schedule to the Act as are appropriate to the circum-stances and have not already been provided for in section 1. Every person and every local authority in the district is hereby invited to submit any proposals which, in his or its opinion, should be considered in the preparation of the proposed scheme. Proposals marked "Waitemata County District Scheme" should be addressed to the County Clerk and delivered at the County Clerk's office, 199 Karangahape Road, Auckland, on or before the 31st day of March 1958.
