Whereas the late Sophia Frances Cherrington-Hunter, formerly of Akaroa, retired beauty specialist, who died at Christchurch on the 16th day of March 1957, by her will, probate whereof was granted on the 25th day of March 1957, devised and bequeathed to the Roman Catholic Bishop for the time being for the Diocese of Christchurch (hereinafter called "the Bishop") her property at Jolie Street, Akaroa, and the furniture and contents therein to be used as a convalescent home for the priests of the Christchurch Diocese.
