COBHAM, Governor-General A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Warrant published in *Gazette*, 10 January 1957, Volume I, page 7, notifying and declaring certain areas to be refuges under the said Act, and to only the extent appearing in the First Schedule hereto, and I proclaim and declare the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto to be wildlife refuges for the purposes of the Wildlife Act 1953.

FIRST SCHEDULE 2. LAKE GRASSMERE
