(45) Matata Lagoon: All that area bounded by the western bank of the Tarawera River from the bridge on the main Whakatane-Tauranga highway to the river mouth, thence north-westerly along the sea coast at low water mark to a point where a straight line drawn due north from the intersection of Awatariki Stream and Arawa Street meets low-water mark, thence southerly along a line marked by white-painted posts to the above intersection, thence easterly along Arawa Street (main Whakatane-Tauranga highway) to the point of commencement, excepting therefrom the Wildlife Refuge and public domain.

(2) All that area in the Canterbury Land District, being Run 78, and known as Lilybank Station: Bounded on the east by the summit of the Two Thumb Range from McClure Peak to the Thumbs Mountain; thence on the south-east by a right line to a stream having its source in the Thumbs, and by that stream to the Macaulay River; thence by the right bank of the Macaulay River to its confluence with the Godley River; thence on the west by the left bank of the Godley River, and on the north by the Godley Glacier to McClure Peak, the place of commencement.

(11) All that area in the Canterbury Land District, being Run 241, and known as Ben McLeod Station in the Rangitata Gorge situated in Blocks I, II, IV, V, and VIII, Mount Peel Survey District, and Blocks IV, VI, VII, VIII, X, XI, and XII, Fox Survey District, and bounded on the north-west by Forest Creek, on the north-east by the Rangitata River, and the east by S.C. Run No. 98, on the south-east by the Hewson River, and on the eastern boundary of the said Run 241 to the Phantom River to Walker's Spur; thence up that spur and along the south-western boundary of the said Run 241 to Forest Creek, the place of commencement.

Southland Acclimatisation District

Reference to Description: Gazette No. 50 of 26 July 1945, at page 945 (excepting therefrom all that country to the north of a line starting at Lake Monowai, and thence down the south side of the Monowai River to the Waiau River, up the west side of the Waiau River to the boundary with the Southern Lakes Acclimatisation District, as defined by a notice board; thence along the boundary of the said acclimatisation district to the main Te Anau - Mossburn road where defined by a notice board; thence along the said Te Anau - Mossburn road to the Whitestone River; thence along the eastern bank of the Whitestone River to the northern corner of Lynwood cultivated land, and thence along the Lynwood fence to the Lynwood-Mararoa boundary fence, and thence along the said boundary fence to the north side of Mararoa cultivated land and down the fence on the eastern side of the cultivated land to the Prospect-Mararoa road, and thence down the said road to the Mararoa Station; thence along the Mararoa Station - Mavora road via the Chimneys Bridge to the junction with the old Te Anau - Mararoa road; thence along the said road to the Oreti River; thence down the western side of the Oreti River to the site of the old accommodation house in the Township of Centre Hill; thence in a straight line to the Township of Athol; thence in a straight line in a northerly direction to the junction of the Mataura River and Robert Creek).
