

COUNTY OF STRATFORD

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Rural Housing Loan No. 6, 1958, £10,000

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Counties Act, and all other Acts and powers (if any) it thereunto enabling, the Stratford County Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of interest, repayment of principal and other charges on the Rural Housing Loan No. 6 1958, £10,000, authorised to be raised by the Stratford County Council, the said County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of $\frac{1}{12}$ pence in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the County of Stratford; and the said special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable on the 1st day of March in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of 25 years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

PAHIATUA BOROUGH COUNCIL

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Housing Loan 1958, £4,500

THAT, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Pahiataua Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the instalments of principal, interest, and other charges on a loan of £4,500 authorised to be raised by the Pahiataua Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of purchasing a section and building a house, the said Pahiataua Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of decimal three pence ($\frac{3}{100}$ d.) in the pound (£) upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the Borough of Pahiataua; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring special rate during the currency of the said loan, being a period of twenty-five (25) years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

At a later date every objection will be open for public inspection and any person who wishes to support or oppose any objection will be entitled to be heard at the hearing of objections if he notifies the undersigned in writing within a period of which public notice will be given.
