## RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

*Fire Engine Loan (1959), £4,000*

PURSUANT to the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Taupo Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of four thousand pounds (£4,000) authorised to be raised by the Taupo Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of purchasing a new fire engine, the said Taupo Borough Council hereby makes a special rate of nought decimal nought eight nine pence (0·089d.) in the pound (£) upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Borough of Taupo; and that the special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of ten (10) years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

## RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

PURSUANT to the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Amuri County Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of £3,000 (three thousand pounds) authorised to be raised by the Amuri County Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of meeting the cost of a workers dwelling, the said Amuri County Council hereby makes a special rate of 0·023 pence in the pound (£) upon the rateable value of all rateable property comprising the Amuri County; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan, being a period of 10 years, or until the loan is fully paid off."
