REEFTON JOCKEY CLUB (INC.) RESOLUTION

AT a special general meeting of the Reefton Jockey Club (Inc.) held on the 28th day of May 1959 at Reefton, it was duly resolved as follows:

"In pursuance and exercise of the powers under section 33 of the Gaming Act 1908, it is hereby resolved that the regula-tions dated the 13th day of December 1922 are hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof the following regulations shall be regula-tions under the said section 33 controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Reefton Racecource situated in the District of Reefton and known as the Reefton Racecourse or to any other racecourse used or occupied by the club for race meetings."

REEFTON JOCKEY CLUB (INC.) REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act 1908)

(Under the Gaming Act 1908) 1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the *Gazette*. 2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act 1908. 3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described or any other racecourse while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely: (a) Rookmakere

- (a) Bookmakers.(b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and book-

- (a) Bookmakers.
  (b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and bookmakers' agents.
  (c) All persons under disqualification imposed under the New Zealand rules of racing or the New Zealand rules of trotting or by the racing or trotting authorities in any country outside New Zealand which have reciprocal agreements in matters of racing or trotting with the New Zealand Racing Conference or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.
  (d) Common prostitutes, idle and disorderly persons within the meaning of the Police Offences Act 1927.
  (e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking, burglary, or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act 1908, and persons convicted under the Police Offences Act 1927 of conversion or attempted conversion of a motorcar or other vehicle or of being idle and disorderly persons or victed of an offence under the Gaming Act 1908, or persons having a criminal record in countries outside New Zealand and the references to the foregoing Acts shall be deemed to apply to any subsequent Act consolidating or in substitution therefor.
