A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act 1949, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the First Schedule hereto, being areas vested in the Auckland Education Board, and the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Wellington Education Board as sites for public schools, shall be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affect-ing the same at the date hereof.

, FIRST SCHEDULE

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT

PART Section 3A, Block VII, Whangape Survey District: Area, 3 roods 5.8 perches, more or less. As shown on the plan marked L. and S. 6/6/855B deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey at Wellington, and thereon edged red. (S.O. Plan 36993.)
