RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Fire Station Loan 1959 of £15,500

THAT, pursuant to the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Henderson Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of £15,500 authorised to be raised by the Henderson Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of erecting a new fire station, the Henderson Borough Council hereby makes a special rate of forty-seven hundredths of a penny (0.47d.) in the pound on the rateable unimproved value of all rateable property in the Borough of Henderson; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of June in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of 25 years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

CONSOLIDATION OF SPECIAL RATES
