

to the westernmost corner of Section 1, Block IX, Rangiriri Survey District; thence easterly along a right line to the westernmost corner of Section 2, Block IX, Rangiriri Survey District, and its production to the middle of the Waikato River; thence southerly generally up the middle of that river to its confluence with the Mangawara Stream; thence south-easterly generally up the middle of the Mangawara Stream, and up the middle of the Komakorau Stream, to its intersection with the southern boundary of Block VI, Komakorau Survey District, and along a right line in the direction of the northernmost corner of Lot 4A, D.P. 3916, to its intersection with the middle of the Auckland-Thames Railway; thence north-easterly along the middle of that railway to its intersection with the production of the western boundary of Lot 9, D.P. 6948, being a point on the boundary of the County of Waikato as described in the *Gazette* of 1959 at page 467; thence south-easterly and south-westerly generally along the boundary of that county to the westernmost corner of part Hinuera No. 2 in Block VI, Cambridge Survey District; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station Y (Opuahau) in Block X, Cambridge Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line in the direction of Trig. Station 52 (Pukekura) in Block XIV, Cambridge Survey District, to the middle of the Waikato River; thence north-westerly down the middle of that river to the eastern boundary of the Borough of Cambridge as described in the *Gazette* of 1958 at page 1732; thence northerly, westerly, and southerly along the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that borough to the middle of the Waikato River; thence again down the middle of that river to the production of a right line between the southernmost corner of Section 204, Tuhikaramea Parish in Block XII, Alexandra Survey District, and the southernmost corner of Section 112, Te Rapa Parish in Block VII, Hamilton Survey District; thence westerly to and along the said right line to the southernmost corner of Section 204, aforesaid; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station Tahuani in Block II, Pirongia Survey District; thence north-westerly along a right line to the south-western corner of Moerangi IC in Block XIII, Alexandra Survey District; and a right line to the junction of Ponds Road with the Kauroa - Te Mata Main Highway; thence south-westerly along a right line to the south-western corner of Section 96 (E.R.), Karioi Parish, Block VIII, Karioi Survey District; thence northerly generally to and along the sea coast, across the entrance to Whaingaroa Harbour, and again along the sea coast to the mouth of the Ohuka Stream, the point of commencement.

Proclaiming a Tribal District Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945 and Consequential Revocation

COBHAM, Governor-General

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedule hereto to be a tribal district for the purposes of the said Act with the name therein set out, and do hereby revoke the earlier Proclamations dated 24 March 1950, 2 February 1957, and 12 October 1959, and published in the *Gazettes* of 30 March 1950 at page 330, 14 February 1957 at page 205, and 29 October 1959 at page 1533.

SCHEDULE

CENTRAL TARANAKI TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Taranaki Land District bounded by a line commencing at the middle of the mouth of the Oaonui River, Block V, Opunake Survey District, and proceeding up the middle of that river to the boundary of the Egmont National Park; thence south-easterly generally along the boundary of the Egmont National Park to the middle of the Otakeho River; thence down the middle of that river to the sea coast; thence north-westerly generally along the sea coast to the point of commencement.

PURSUANT to subsection (2) of section 19 of the Forests Act 1949, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting on the joint recommendation of the Minister of Lands and of the Minister of Forests, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being provisional State forest reserve set apart by Proclamation dated the 21st day of September 1925, and published in *Gazette*, 24 September 1925, Volume III, page 2615, is required for settlement purposes; and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act such land shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forest land and shall become Crown land available for sale, lease, reservation, or other disposition under the provisions of the Land Act 1948.

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act 1949, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Auckland Education Board, and the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Wellington Education Board, as sites for public schools shall be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.
