Bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the west and east branches of the Sabine River and proceeding westerly along a right line to Mount Windward; thence southerly generally along the western watershed of the west branch of the Sabine River to Mount Mahanga, being a point on the summit of the Spenser Mountains; thence north-easterly generally along the summit of the said Spenser Mountains to the eastern watershed of the west branch of the Sabine River; thence northerly generally along the last-mentioned watershed through Mount Franklyn to the point of commencement. point of commencement.

As the same is more particularly delineated on a plan marked L. and S. N.P. 26B deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey at Wellington, and thereon edged red.

The wilderness area will be subject to the restrictions imposed by section 34 of the National Parks Act 1952 and by the Nelson Lakes National Park Bylaws.
